DID YOU KNOW? by Eurena Beers

DID YOU KNOW that the first Sunday School picnics were really family picnics? Families came from all corners of the township some with baskets of food. It was a day of worship, fun, food and fellowship with other Sunday School members, neighbors and friends. They arrived via horse and buggy, horse and hack, or trudged on foot over dusty roads. Horses were housed in the horse sheds by the road or tied onto the railing by the cemetery.

The excited children were organized to march to the picnic area and they were thrilled to receive a free five-cent ticket from the Sunday School. The band struck up the music and the children happily followed the band marching through the cemetery with their teachers.

A religious service always preceded all activities. The old pedal organ was carried out from the church. Paul Berger was one of the first organists to play at the picnic. The pastor, Rev. Smith or a guest speaker gave a message.

The band presented an afternoon concert much to the pleasure of the listeners who seldom had the opportunity to hear such rousing music. (There were few radios then and no T.V.)

Toward evening, tables were set up for supper. Homemade bread, fried chicken, tasty pies and cakes were just a few of the items that they had. The band was the first to enjoy the food, then the men and children and the women ate last.

An exact date for the first picnic is unknown but John Smith logged in his Sunday School record book: 1911 picnic, \$70.01.

In an interview with the late Ralph Strohl years ago he relayed: "Early on, band members were transported from Parryville or Lehighton to the picnic in a large wagon called an Omnibus drawn by a double team of horses. The men were taken to the picnic, then the horses were housed in a barn at Schatzle's Hotel in Trachsville.

REFRESHMENTS SOLD AT THE PICNIC

The picnic area was small and had only one stand. Ice cream served on china plates sold for a penny a plate. Obert's bologna hung in the stand and chunks were cut off and sold. Remember the "Grund niss", peanuts that is? They sold for a nickel a bag. Ed Smith bagged them from a large burlap bag using a glass mug. Remember the Zig-Zag? That delightful caramel popcorn—the forerunner of Cracker Jack. Moxie was perhaps the first bottled soda. Later hot dogs were introduced. Cooked on a kerosene stove, they sold for a nickel in a slice of bread.

CAKE WALKS

Does anyone know when cakewalks began or when they became cake stands?

LIVESTOCK NEEDED ATTENTION

Being strictly a farming area, livestock needed attention at feeding time. Heads of families headed home to milk cows, gather eggs and feed the livestock. They returned to enjoy the rest of the picnic.

PICNIC LIGHTS

To lengthen the picnic when darkness fell, kerosene or gaslights were attached to trees. About 1930 Clinton Strohl wired the picnic grove for electricity. A generator provided electricity. ***********
