 This year has been a crazy ride for our Church's finances. As you can see, we had a lot of building project expenses between our new

 Hope Hall addition, our Friendship Room, and our Sanctuary renovations.
 The majority of the new building project was covered by donations,

 with a smaller \$350,000 mortgage which was taken to make up for the increased construction costs post-COVID.
 We have been making

 principal and interest payments of \$2275.11 since March, 2023, and have collected on average \$1,100.00 per month in Building Fund donations

 over the last 6 months, thus the line item which has been added for Mortgage Payments.

 Our hourly employees will receive a 3% hourly increase, and our Pastor will receive a 4% increase in salary.
 I think this proposed

 budget is a good balance of our needs in the coming year now that things have settled down relative to our building and renovation projects.
 We are in a good position financially, and I look forward to what the future holds for us, as we continue to grow, and welcome people to

 come back home to Jerusalem UCC!

LETTER FROM JILLIAN HESSINGER

Dear Jerusalem UCC,

It has been quite a journey! It's not over yet, but I wanted to celebrate and share some answered prayers that have taken place along the way. You have possibly heard Pastor Marian ask for prayers for me, have seen my name on the prayer list or if you've spoken to my parents, Paul and Wendy Hoppel, you might have heard some of my story. To anyone that thought of me, prayed for me, put me on their prayer lists, visited me in the hospital, sat with me, fed me, called, sent cards, sent messages, sent beautiful and funny photos, sent texts, emails, and those of you who followed and responded to my husband, Micah's updates, on Facebook and my family's updates and text chains I can't begin to thank you enough! I am truly blessed and grateful to have such a phenomenal force of positive encouraging family, friends, and acquaintances behind me! I am sending love and blessings back to you tenfold. After almost 3 weeks in the hospital, I finally received a diagnosis, a treatment plan and then was discharged. That was definitely something to celebrate as an answered prayer. And we did celebrate! My amazing Mom made me my favorite home cooked meal (not hospital food, I definitely celebrated that!) of pork and homemade sauerkraut (Dad made that), mashed potatoes and lima beans with a from scratch chocolate cake for dessert! An extra special thank you goes out to Pastor Marian. I have found her to be an awesome pastor, prayer warrior, visionary for positive results and an overall great cheerleader for healing. She came to see me in the hospital and called to check on me often. While I was happy to finally be home and discharged from the hospital, there were other complications that occurred. "Shine Jesus Shine" is one of my favorite church songs and one of my favorite books is titled Ever-Flowing Streams. Pastor Marian suggested a vision of a flowing stream for a solution to one of those complications after I was home from the hospital. She didn't know how meaningful the song and book were to me, but yet she had me envision flowing streams. The idea of envisioning flowing streams was to heal my veins and for them to accept the infusion I needed. The previous week I wasn't able to get the weekly infusion due to blood clots in one arm and extremely bruised arms and fragile veins in the other arm. Her suggested envisioning worked and our prayers were answered by being able to get the next three infusions I needed to complete the first part of my treatment plan! I don't believe that is a coincidence, I believe that is the Holy Spirit working! The chorus of "Shine Jesus Shine" goes like this Shine, Jesus, shine Fill this land with the Father's glory Blaze, Spirit, blaze Set our hearts on fire Flow, river, flow Flood the nations with grace and mercy Send forth your word Lord, and let there be light Thank you Pastor Marian for being a blazing spirit and light! God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit are certainly shining their grace, mercy and healing through her word and deed! We can celebrate Pastor Marian and all of the answered prayers she facilitated. I have also been thoroughly blessed with a supportive husband and daughter that are holding everything together, a wonderful sister and her family, a caring brother and his family, my incredible parents, my faithful mother-in-law and a great crew of in-home nurses, occupational therapists and physical therapists. They have been an answer to my prayers and another thing to celebrate! Going forward, there is a lot more to figure out yet. I humbly ask that if you could keep me in your prayers and keep thinking positive thoughts for a little longer, I would greatly appreciate it. I am seeking healing and a full and successful recovery with functional hands and feet. I would like to wholeheartedly thank you all again and let you know how truly grateful I am! Keep the faith, keep celebrating and keep sharing the Good News!
